

OUR ATLANTIC MARITIMES TOUR ITINERARY:

Sunday September 17 - Day 1: Travel to **Saint John, NB** where you will meet your tour director at your hotel. **(Dinner)**

Monday September 18 - Day 2: . Depart on the 8:00am **ferry** for your 2 1/2-hour crossing of the Bay of Fundy to Digby, NS. Continue through the scenic Annapolis Valley to Grand Pre, NS. Visit **Grand Pre National Historic Site** where you will learn about the expulsion of the French Acadians from "Acadie" in 1755. In addition to the graceful stone church commemorating the deportation, this site also features a statue of "Evangeline", the heroine of Longfellow's epic poem. Enjoy some free time in **Wolfville** to explore and take in some lunch before visiting one of Nova Scotia's premier wineries for a **Wine Tour and Tasting**. After your wine tour, travel to Halifax where you will be staying the next two nights. **(Breakfast, Dinner)**

Tuesday September 19 – Day 3: This morning travel to the quaint fishing village of **Peggy's Cove** where you will eat **breakfast** overlooking the lighthouse that sits on top of wave washed rocks. There will be time to explore on your own. Afterwards travel to the UNESCO World Heritage town of **Lunenburg**, once one of the busiest ship building towns in Nova Scotia and take time to explore on your own. Make a picture stop in **Mahone Bay** well known for the three churches on the harbour. Return to your hotel later this afternoon. **(Breakfast, Dinner)**

Wednesday September 20 – Day 4: Travel to the Canso Causeway and cross to **Cape Breton**, the Scotland of North America. Cape Breton's most famous resident, Alexander Graham Bell, once said, "I have traveled around the globe. I have seen the Canadian and American Rockies, the Andes, the Alps and the Highlands of Scotland, but for simple beauty, Cape Breton outrivals them all." Continue to Baddeck and visit the **Alexander Graham Bell Museum**. Bell fell in love with the region and built his beautiful estate on the shores of the Bras d'Or Lakes. Discover his legacy from his humanitarian accomplishments to his gigantic

kites, airplanes, a boat that flew, and more at this fascinating museum. Arrive at your Cape Breton accommodations, where you will spend two nights. **(Breakfast, Dinner)**

Thursday September 21 – Day 5: Today you will discover first hand why Conde Nast magazine readers rated Cape Breton one of the top ten most beautiful islands in the world! Named for explorer John Cabot, the **Cabot Trail** winds around the rocky splendour of Cape Breton's northern shore, ascending to the incredible plateaus of **Cape Breton Highlands National Park**. Lookoffs offer unforgettable vista of Cape Breton's rugged coastline so be sure to have your camera ready! While travelling the Cabot Trail, stop in Cheticamp, well known for its "hooked crafts" and Acadian culture. Return to your hotel for the night. **(Breakfast, Box Lunch, Dinner)**

Friday September 22 – Day 6: Re-cross the Canso Causeway to mainland Nova Scotia and continue to Caribou for your 75-minute **ferry** crossing of the Northumberland Strait to Wood Island, Prince Edward Island and continue to **Charlottetown**. Enjoy a short city tour before checking into your hotel for a two night stay. This evening attend a performance of "Anne – The Musical" at the Charlottetown Festival. **(Breakfast, Dinner)**

Saturday September 23 – Day 7: Travel to the beautiful North Shore of the Island and visit **Green Gables**, famous around the world as the inspiration for the setting in Lucy Maud Montgomery's classic tale of fiction, Anne of Green Gables. Also visit **Prince Edward Island National Park**, renowned for its red sandstone cliffs, fine white sand beaches and rolling sand dunes. End your day with a Maritime tradition, the **Lobster Supper**. Tasty chowder or soup, delicious locally cultivated mussels, salad and homemade rolls accompany a one-pound lobster (meat alternative available). And, if you still have room, treat yourself to a dazzling array of scrumptious sweets! Return to your hotel for the night. **(Breakfast, Dinner)**

Sunday September 24 – Day 8: Stop at **Gateway Village** for your morning break. Cross **Confederation Bridge**, the world's longest multi-span bridge over tidal water, to New Brunswick. Travel to **Hopewell Rocks**. At Hopewell Rocks, see where the world's highest tides have gouged four-story sculptures from the cliffs. At low tide, the Rocks look like giant flowerpots; at high tide, they practically disappear. Also, tour the **Interpretation Centre** and, if the tide is low, walk on the ocean floor. Travel through Fundy National Park as you make your way to St. Andrews by the Sea where you will spend your final night in the Maritimes. **(Breakfast, Dinner)**

Monday September 25 – Day 9: Say farewell to your local tour director after breakfast this morning. Travel to Campobello Island where Franklin D. Roosevelt had a summer cottage. Explore the cottage and enjoy **Tea with Eleanor**. Continue home to Boston, MA. When you cross the border into the U.S., remember to set your watch back one hour. **(Breakfast)**
