OUR BRITISH PANORAMA TOUR ITINERARY IS AS FOLLOWS:

DAY 1: BOSTON-LONDON: Depart Logan International Airport on a flight to London. Meal and beverages will be served en route.

DAY 2: LONDON, ENGLAND: Check-in to our hotel. In the afternoon there will be time to rest or start exploring the lively British capital. Uniformed hosts are available to help us make the most of our stay. Dinner on our own this evening. Overnight.

DAY 3: LONDON: We will have a full-day to enjoy an exciting program of optional activities. Morning sightseeing features all of the famous landmarks: Royal Albert Hall, Chelsea, Knightsbridge with Harrods, the Houses of Parliament and Big Ben. Highlights are a visit to Westminster Abbey and Changing of the Guard at Buckingham Palace (*if held*). This afternoon, we will have an INCLUDED visit to Windsor Castle, the Queen's favorite residence and the largest inhabited castle in the world. Dinner on our own. Overnight. (BB)

DAY 4: LONDON-YORK-SCOTCH CORNER: Meet our Tour Director and traveling companions and depart for a day of northbound travel. Enjoy a walking tour in the university city of Cambridge, one of the country's oldest seats of learning. In York, England's most complete Medieval city, stand in awe in front of the great structure of York Minster. Then, follow our Tour Director through the maze of quaint streets, including the narrow Shambles. Stop for the night near Richmond, gateway to the Yorkshire Dales, made famous by James Herriot's "*All Creatures Great and Small*". Dinner and overnight. (BB, D)

DAY 5: SCOTCH CORNER-EDINBURGH, SCOTLAND: Inspect a Section of Hadrian's Wall, the Roman coast-to-coast defense against marauding northern tribes. Next, we will motor through wild Northumberland National Park to the Scottish. Stop for photos at Jedburgh and a view of the house of Mary, Queen of Scots. We will also see *Melrose*, with its 12th century ruins and connections with Robert the Bruce. Arrival in Edinburgh for check-in at our hotel. Tonight, we will enjoy a "Scottish Evening" with dinner, wine, and Highland Show with singers, dancers, bagpipers, and of course, the Ceremony of the Haggis! Overnight. (FB, D)

DAY 6: EDINBURGH: A full-day to enjoy this "Prince of Cities". Morning sightseeing with a local expert introduces you to the 200-year-old "New Town" and famous scientists, inventors and novelists. In the "Old Town", drive up the narrow Royal Mile to Edinburgh Castle to admire Scotland's Crown Jewels. The afternoon is at leisure. This evening, we will board the former Royal Yacht *Britannia*, which for the Queen was once the perfect royal residence for glittering state visits and family holidays. We will tour five decks and see how the Royal Family and crew lived and worked. Dinner onboard rounds out our evening. Overnight at our hotel in Edinburgh. (FB, D)

DAY 7: EDINBURGH-CHESTER, ENGLAND-LIVERPOOL: Head south through the history-steeped Lowland Hills and a visit to Gretna Green, where the blacksmith used to wed runaway couples. Drive through the beautiful scenery in the Lake District, considered to be the finest of England's national parks. Visit Wordsworth's *Grasmere*, then follow the shore of Lake Windermere to Chester, the historic town on the River Dee. Our walking tour of Chester includes the Roman remains, the black and white half-timbered buildings and the two-tiered arcades called "The Rows". End our day with hotel check-in in Liverpool of Beatles fame. Dinner and overnight. (FB, D)

DAY 8: LIVERPOOL-STRATFORD-ON-AVON-BRISTOL: Cross into Wales to picturesque Llangollen, home of an international competition for poets and minstrels. Back in England, tour fascinating Stratford-on-Avon, a living monument to William Shakespeare. Then, drive through the scenic Cotswold Hills with stops for photos in picture-book Broadway. Overnight in Bristol, where our panoramic sightseeing drive focuses on the great English entrepreneur Isambard Kingdom Brunel's daring 700-foot Clifton Suspension Bridge and the *SS Great Britain*, which he designed and built in 1843. We will also see historic Bristol harbor from where John Cabot sailed in 1497 for his "discovery" of America. (FB, D)

DAY 9: BRISTOL-BATH-LONDON: A day of memorable highlights with a visit first to the elegant Georgian city of Bath, famous for its Roman relics. Continue-on via Stonehenge – still an intriguing mystery – to Salisbury, the "City of the Soaring Spire". Return to London for check-in at our hotel. Dinner is on our own this evening. Overnight. (FB)

DAY 10: LONDON-BOSTON: After breakfast and hotel check-out, we will transfer to the airport for our transatlantic return flight to Boston, which arrives the same day. (BB)
