OUR 5-DAY/3-NIGHT EXTRAORDINARY ICELAND TOUR ITINERARY:

DAY 1 - BOSTON-KEFLAVIK: Depart Boston's Logan International Airport aboard our regularly scheduled flight to Keflavik, Iceland, with meal and beverage service available while aloft.

DAY 2 - REYKJAVIK: Early morning arrival in Keflavik Airport. Meet-and-greet with our English-speaking guide. During the 45-minute transfer to Reykjavik through old lava flows which dominate the Reykjanes Peninsula, our guide will give us an introduction to enchanting Iceland. Upon arrival in Reykavik, the northernmost capital in the world, we will have a guided city tour of Reykjavik by motorcoach. Weaving our way through narrow alleys framed with old timber houses, we will learn about the life of the city from its very beginning to the present day. We will visit the harbor, the old town centre, the Parliament, the national museum, Laugadalur swimming pool, Hallgrimskirkja Church and the University. A photo stop will be offered at Höfði House, where the Reagan-Gorbachev summit meeting took place in 1986. Then we'll head to our hotel in downtown Reykjavik for check-in and time at leisure before our included dinner. Tonight, you may wish to search the skies for the Northern Lights (Aurora Borealis), among the most spectacular phenomena on Earth. (D)

DAY 3 - GOLDEN CIRCLE TOUR: Wake and enjoy breakfast at the hotel. Then we set out on today's excursion- Iceland's signature tour, the Golden Circle. The tour includes many of the scenic natural wonders for which Iceland is justly renowned. We will drive over the highland plateau of Hellisheiði, passing the geothermal town of Hveragerði to reach picturesque Kerio, a lake-filled extinct volcanic crater. We will continue to Skálholt, the site of an ancient bishopric, and for centuries Iceland's main cultural center. Next, we will explore the otherworldly hot spring area of Geysir - multicolored pools of water and mud. Strokkur, the Great Geysir's little brother, erupts to a height of about 80-feet and erupts at about 5 to 7 minute intervals. After a lunch break (on our own), we will drive to the mighty Gullfoss (the Golden Waterfall), perhaps the most beautiful in the country. We can walk around Gullfoss Falls, where the river Hvitá tumbles 100-feet in a double cascade. When the sun is shining, one is likely to see a



rainbow through the massive spray that forms. Then, a scenic drive to reach Thingvellir National Park for a stroll around the country's most sacred site, home of the old Viking parliament Alpingi and major events in Iceland's history. Thingvellir is a place of fascinating natural beauty, right on Iceland's largest lake - Thingvallavatn. Return to Reykjavik for time at leisure and dinner on your own. (B)

DAY 4 - REYKJANES PENINSULA & BLUE LAGOON: Breakfast at the hotel this morning. Today's journey brings us out beyond Rekjavik to the Rekjanes Peninsula. Heading out from the capital, our tour will take us to Hafnarfjodur town, which was built on an ancient lava flow. Then it's on to see the otherworldly surroundings of Lake Kleifarvatn, a lake which shrunk by nearly 20 percent after a 2000 earthquake but has regained its original surface area. Then it's on to Krisuvik, a geothermal field where powerful jets of steam esecape from deep below the earth's crust. Finally, we visit Grindavik, a fishing town on the southeast peninsula, home to the Saltfish Museum. Nearby is also a U.S. Naval Communication facility. After visiting Grindavik, we travel roughly three miles outside of town to perhaps the most famous attraction in all of Iceland- the Blue Lagoon! A surreal steaming spring glowing blue created by the nearby thermal plant, the Blue Lagoon is like a giant natural hot tub. While a visit alone would be rewarding, our tour provides admission and a towel so you can actually bathe in the healthy waters. The remainder of the day is at leisure. Dinner on our own this evening. Overnight at our Reykjavik hotel. (B)

DAY 5 – KEFLAVIK-BOSTON: After breakfast and hotel check-out, we have time at leisure in the marvelous capital of Reykjavik before we transfer to Keflavik International Airport for our short return flight to Boston with meal and beverage service available while aloft. (B)
